

Preserving Buildings Which Atomic-bombed

Even only high schools, 3 schools make dramas about atomic bomb every year. However the opportunity and places to show the dramas are few. It costs high to make *hifukushisho* to be a theater, but if we make it a theater, the opportunity will increase and people can feel about war from the buildings. In addition, if we can run the theater, we can get some money every year. Moreover, it connects to revival of the city if we hold events of peace commemoration in it.

“They have quit different whether they will be demolished while people are mourning or people are unconcerned.” It is sentence of someone campaigning for preservation of *hifukushisho*. It is important that people the result they will be preserved or not to do. However it's more important that people have opinions about it and think how we preserve them.
